Now, there is a clock below, can you tell what time is it?




## **Time Phrases**

Time phrases are expressions or group of words used to describe when a certain action occurred or to indicate the duration of the action.


#### **TIME PHRASES**

We can also tell the time using phrases just by looking at the hands of the clock. Take a look at the watch below.









#### LAS POSADAS AROUND THE WORLD!

Different countries celebrate Las Posadas in their own culture. Look at the clock's hands and write what the time in the clock tells in time phrases.






















# **DESIGNING PIÑATA**
